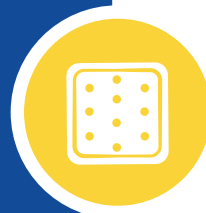

Simplify your seeding process with these helpful planting tips!



Consistent placement

When planting small-seeded crops, focus on consistent placement and depth to achieve uniform emergence and quicker canopy closure. Target a uniform planting depth of 0.5-1" to reduce how many weeds emerge ahead of the crop and aid in slightly faster, more consistent maturity.



Know your target

An established stand of 7-10 plants per square foot offers the best chance of the crop meeting its yield potential. While similar yield potential can be achieved with as few as 5 plants per square foot, it provides little breathing room for plant mortality during the season.



Slow down

It's tempting to increase your planting speed to beat an incoming rainstorm or cover more acres each day, but higher speeds bury some rows deeper, making them slower to emerge (if at all). Find the right planting speed that provides accurate seed placement and maintain the speed.



Seed to soil contact

Seed to soil contact is crucial in regards to small seeded broadleaves like canola. Good seed to soil contact will insure even emergence, which long term will increase yield at the end of the year.
